

# **ABOUT AFC+A**

Americas for Conservation +the Arts is an environmental non profit advancing community resilience through a citizenry of environmental stewards for public health, and leveraging arts and culture for conservation gains



A Puerto Rican led & founded 501(c)(3) environmental non-profit, AFC+A is Colorado and Puerto Rico based with an international reach.

### **OUR CHALLENGES**

We advance a diverse and inclusive conservation movement for environmental and public health, advocacy, and culturally relevant education initiatives that address the needs of previously undeserved and underrepresented communities in the environmental movement. The Latino community in the US is suffering the brunt of the effects of air pollution and climate change. Statistics show Latinos are at the forefront of the climate crisis and are disproportionately impacted by climate change related issues.

- Hispanics were reported as uninsured, compared to 10.4% of non-Latino Whites
- 1 in 5 Latino adults are unable to pay for asthma medicines, furthering the disproportionate impacts of air pollution.
- Of the top 10 most polluted cities in the nation, six count Latinos as 40 % or more of their populations.
- 66% Latinos live in areas that fall below the EPA's air quality safety standards 72% in Colorado.

- Hispanic children are 70% more likely to be admitted to the hospital and twice as likely to die from asthma as non-Hispanics.
- Latinos are 30% more likely to visit a hospital due to asthma compared to non-Latino Whites.
- Latinos are three times as likely to die of asthma.
- Latinos represent the highest uninsured rates of any racial/ethnic group in the US. In 2012.
- Today minorities make up 40% of the US population but only 13% of environmental organizations.
- Latinos are the majority of 200 metropolitan districts in the US and live in areas with high vehicle traffic and power plant activity often violating clean air rules
- Of the country's 58 million Latinos, half live in the 15 worst areas for ground-level ozone pollution-
- Half of the nation's crop and livestock production workers and a third of construction workers are Latinos, working in outdoor jobs that put us at high risk from extreme heat.
- Farm and construction workers who feed us and shelter us account for 60% of job-related heat deaths, and Latinos are three-fold more at risk of dying from the heat on the job than non-Hispanics.

# INTRODUCTION FROM THE DIRECTORS

The history of Americas for Conservation + the Arts is young, somewhat emotional, and filled with longing but its story is very old, almost ancient: the need to reconcile peoples and places for a sustainable future.

We are extremely grateful for the support Americas for Conservation + the Arts (AFC+A) has received throughout recent years helping us grow into the organization that we are today: The first and only Boricua founded and led environmental organization of its size in the United States and one of only a handful of Latino founded and led. Today brown citizens make up 40% of the US population but only 10% of environmental organizations.

Supporting organizations like AFC+A is a direct action to bridge this shameful gap and advance a sustainable future where those sitting at the decision making table regarding the stewardship of our natural resources reflect equity and inclusion.

2018 was a successful year for our organization. We have continued to tackle environmental problems from many angles and used Arte y Cultura as a communication channel for environmental awareness and shared values. All our programs aim at environmental and multicultural education and a diverse, and inclusive conservation agenda.

AFC+A launched its work in Puerto Rico within 72 hours of Hurricane Maria's landfall through the Resiliency Fund and its Guagua Solidaria (solidarity bus). Farming brigades helped revitalize local food systems and the agro-ecology sector of the island. La Guagua Solidaria-- a 24 months campaign to assist in the recuperation of 200 agro-ecology farming projects-- came to life as a repurposed old eco-tourist van outfitted with a handmade roof rack and a mobile tool shed.

The island holds more permits for transgenic seed experimentation than anywhere else in the U.S. or its territories. Culturally dominant staples like rice and beans, and even pork are almost entirely outsourced. Puerto Rico is a food desert in many ways and thus La Guagua Solidaria has in pushing the agro-ecological movement, moved beyond focusing solely on farms to also educating communities at large to start growing their own food.

Given the history and successful proof of concept "LA GUAGUA SOLIDARIA 1.0" represents,

AFC+A welcomed the opportunity to collaborate with Recuperación Agricola, a program of the Puerto Rico Science, Technology and Research Trust by providing an edition of the solidarity bus adaptable to the technical services required yet anchored in our legacy. This February-March 2019 initiative we called "LA GUAGUA SOLIDARIA 2.0": The technical Intervention bus.

In April 2019 we launched the GUAGUA SOLIDARIA 3.0 concentrating our food security efforts in one region of Arecibo/Hatillo/Camuy providing land clearing support to the Asociacion de Agricultores Camuyanos. This phase is anchored in our signed MOU with the Mayor of Camuy and the Asociacion. The 3.0 chapter of La Guagua will concentrate on expanding crop yield by increasing land use through clearing. Between June 2019 and December 2019 La Guagua 3.0 will complete its Fondo de Resiliencia 24 months/200 food projects campaign.

Though AFCA's recuperation efforts on the island began with the Guagua Solidaria, our work has quickly expanded to include multiple initiatives supported in part by The Conservation Fund and AFC+A's current five-year master agreement with USDA and the US Forest Service (2016-2021) which includes expansion contracts for food security literacy and environmental stewardship on the island (2018-2020). Our three umbrella initiatives are now housed under the Puerto Rico Resilience Project (PRRP) and include: La Guagua Solidaria, Promotores Verdes, and the Festival Ecologico de Las Americas (FELA). As of March 2019, our flagship Promotores Verdes program is active in Puerta de Tierra, Santurce, Hato Rey, Cano Martin Pena & Las Monjas, Camuy, Orocovis, Hoya Llanita-Penuelas, and University of Puerto Rico.

Our work has been recognized by the Hispanic Federation Amanece Fund, the Annenberg Foundation, USDA, The Nature Conservancy, Milton A. & Charlotte R. Kamer Charitable Foundation, The Morning Star Foundation, Maine Community Foundation, The Oscar & Evelyn Overton Charitable Foundation, Puerto Rico Unidos, among many other national and international entities.

# **Puerto Rico Solidarity Brigades**

### **Guagua Solidaria 1.0**

Impact: 85 farms and families to date

October 2017 - December 2018

The Puerto Resilience Fund and The Guagua Solidaria is a 24 months, 200 food projects, primarily benefiting farmers and the communities that are served by them while at the same time advancing the restoration and protection of the natural resources and ecosystems that are critical for long-term food security of rural and urban communities in Puerto Rico. In its first year the Guagua concentrated on immediate relief efforts powered by a core staff of five members and volunteer brigades that were often foreign and not Puerto Rican based.

### **Guagua Solidaria 2.0**

Impact: 10 farmers and families

February-March 2019 In Partnership with Recuperacion Agricola/Puerto Rico Science. **Techonology** Research Trust After a first year audit of vision and impact, AFC+A reconfigures the structure of the brigades to include only one core staff-rather than five-and sub contract professional staff for the specific needs of each farm. Brigades' volunteers are recruited in each municipality and near region advancing in the process AFC+A's Promotores Verdes program. Phase two reduces cost of each brigade by 70% and considerably increases rate of response to the farm and quality of service/support given to the farmer. This phase also builds more capacity for Puerto Rican' paid volunteer worker force.

# **Promotores Verdes (PV)**

# Advancing a culture of recreation, conservation, and public health anchored in nature experiences and a sustainable outdoors economy

**Promotores Verdes** (PV) is a citizen driven movement that advances the personal, historical, and economic healing of the island through a new socio eco-nomic model for healthy livelihoods anchored in nature-based connections, environmental stewardship, and outdoor recreation.

Our program develops leadership within families to understand the deep connection between our health and a healthy environment. Our program protects and conserves the environment by offering environmental and climate change literacy. Our work leverages and preserves the cultural and historic heritage of people and places to grow authentic eco-social justice and civic engagement skills. Our work strengthens the confidence, power and cohesion of the family unit.

Promotores Verdes is conceived as a holistic family based umbrella program with educational platforms geared towards two key age groups (a) 4th graders (make or break year) interventions via citizen science driven bio blitzes on public lands and (b) Teenagers eco cultura camps via our United Cultures for Arts and Nature camps (the PV youth arm) creating opportunities through nature immersion camps and service to become environmental and health stewards of tomorrow.







# PV: U-CAN United Cultures for Arts + Nature



Launched in 2017, the summer camp of Promotores Verdes, United Cultures for Arts + Nature Green Ambassadors powers the next generation of diverse leaders by igniting a deeprooted and lasting passion for conservation anchored in science, arts, and culture.

The one week long outdoors immersion camp offers a curriculum built to empower youth to take action in their communities to promote healthy lifestyles, sustainable practices, environmental stewardship, and skills for outdoors recreation interpretation and leadership. U-CAN provides these young ambassadors with support through mentorship and fosters self expression and growth.

This environment enables students to enhance emotional intelligence, navigate adversity, build personal resilience, and strength in themselves that is necessary to protect our resilient natural world and its limited resources.






